William-Hill Roberson was born on March 20, 1988, in George Washington University Hospital, Washington, DC to Deborah Shaw and the late Antwan Roberson. Antwon attended Merritt Extended Elementary School and graduated with the Class of 2007 from Crossland High School in Temple Hills, Maryland.

After high school, Antwon attended Prince George's County Community College for a short period of time and worked a series of jobs at places such as Shoe City, My Playce Family Fun Room, and the American Diabetes Association. While at the American Diabetes Association, Antwon learned about career opportunities with D.C.

Department of Corrections. Soon Antwon completed the academy and became Corporal Antwon William-Hill Roberson. He served with distinction at the D.C. Department of Corrections for over ten years.

Antwon was nurtured in Campbell African Methodist Episcopal Church where Reverend Roger Hall Reed baptized him as a child. Antwon was active in church school, the Young People's Department, Boy Scout Troop 1869, fishing club, junior usher board, and the church's youth choir. Most recently, Antwon became a member of the church's media ministry.

When he became a first time uncle last year, he bought his new nephew outfits to highlight most of the local teams. As the son of a musician, Antwon's appreciation for music spanned multiple eras and genres.
